Moranbah State High School 2023 Sports Program

Moranbah State High School is widely recognised for its sporting involvement. It has an extensive sporting calendar in which all students can be involved in a variety of different activities, from recreational sports in lunchtime competitions to multiple opportunities to represent the school at both inter-school and representative school sport.



Inter-house Lunchtime Sports

Inter-house lunchtime sports provide all students with the opportunity to play a recreational sport during their lunch breaks. The competitions are organised and run by the Sports Captain and junior and senior house captains throughout the school year.

Inter-house Sporting Carnivals

Throughout the year, students are given the opportunity to battle it out in their houses in three Inter-house Sporting Carnivals. The first carnival of the year is cross country at the end of Term 1 with the athletics carnival at the end of term 2. These carnivals provide an opportunity for students to gain selection into the associated Central Highlands district teams and possibly achieve selection into Capricornia and State levels. Early in Term 4, we finish off with the inter-house swimming carnival as the nominations for representative levels of swimming do not require students to have competed in the school carnival.

Inter-school sport

Inter-school sport provides students the opportunity to compete in variety of competitions including the Mackay District Secondary Schools Competitions in both Netball and Rugby League (boys and girls). Other opportunities include premier competitions such as the Vicki Wilson Cup Championship (Netball), NRL School Boys Competition (Rugby League), Karen Murphy Cup (Girls Rugby League), AFL Schools Cup (AFL) and Western 7's (Rugby Union). To be eligible to nominate for these teams, students must consistently demonstrate the school's core values and, at times, may be required to undergo a selection process. By nominating for a team, students are committing themselves to attend training and fitness sessions that are offered for their sport, travelling to and from the competition with the team and staying with the team (if required). All permission form paperwork and payment fees (may include registration, travel, accommodation and food) must be submitted by the due date to be eligible to attend.

Representative School Sport

As part of the Denham and Central Highlands District, Moranbah State High School students have the opportunity to be selected for a representative position in their chosen sport. To be considered for a position in these teams, students must nominate themselves and may be required to attend a school trial. Once students have nominated themselves, the Sports Coordinator will provide them with a nomination form. Information regarding trial nominations and dates will be advertised through daily notices and school and year level parades. A hard-copy of the school sport calendar will also be sent home at the start of the year.



The number of students that attend a trial and its location determines if staff will also attend. In most cases it is the responsibility of the parent or carer to transport students to and from sporting trials. It is important to note that if students are selected for a representative team and do not participate in the next level of selection they will still be invoiced for the costs involved. They may also be ineligible to be selected for other sporting teams at this level of representation.

Due to numbers, paper nominations are often used for selection into Central Highlands teams. In these circumstances, the CH nomination paperwork must be submitted by the due date with the administration fee (paid to the office by the due date). If successful, students will receive Capricornia trial paperwork via email.

Celebration of Sporting Achievement

Moranbah State High School celebrates the sporting achievement of our students at our annual Sports Awards held in Term 4. At this ceremony, students that achieved selection into a representative team will receive an award for their success. Students that have represented the school at inter-school sport or received age champion at one of our inter-house carnivals will also be acknowledged. Awards are given to those students that have been identified as the best and fairest and most improved (for competitions over a number of weeks only) for inter-school sporting teams. Special awards will also be given to those students that have excelled across a number of sports throughout the year.



Moranbah State High School 2023 Instrumental Music Program

Moranbah State High School proudly offers grade 7-12 students the opportunity to learn a Woodwind, Brass or Percussion instrument as part of Education Queensland's Instrumental Music Program.

Music is an important aspect in the education of a child. By undertaking Instrumental Music, a student develops and strengthens personal skills such as commitment, patience, social interaction, confidence, and perseverance. Many Instrumental Music students continue playing their instrument as adults, as a hobby or as career musician. Music is a skill for life that connects people from all backgrounds.

Our Instrumental Music students perform regularly within our school, the wider Moranbah community, and at regional events.

It is hoped that all Year 7 students who learnt an instrument in Primary School will continue to learn their instrument at Moranbah State High School.

Instrumental Lessons

All students who enroll in instrumental music will receive a weekly 35-minute group lesson during class time on Tuesdays. Lessons run on a rotating timetable so that students do not miss the same class each week. Students will be allocated to groups based on their individual progress and current Instrumental Music Curriculum Level. Participation in lessons is a compulsory component of the Instrumental Music Program

Instrumental Ensembles

The Moranbah State High School Concert Band rehearses from 7:30 am to 8:30 am on Tuesday mornings. Participation in this ensemble is a compulsory component of the Instrumental Music Program.

Participation Fee

A participation fee of \$50.00 will be charged to all students in Term 1 of the school year. This fee contributes to the purchase of sheet music and consumables used in the Instrumental Music Program.

Instrument Hire Fee

A limited number of school instruments are available for hire at a cost of \$100.00. This fee contributes to the cost of maintenance and care and is only charged to students borrowing a school instrument.

Expectations of Students

Instrumental Music students are expected to demonstrate a high level of responsible behaviour and personal organisation. This includes weekly attendance to lessons and Concert Band rehearsals.

Students are also expected to complete regular home practice. Students will be given weekly practice homework and should aim to complete 20-30 minutes of practice, 4 to 5 times per week. Regular practice allows the student to progress through the curriculum and confidently participate in ensembles. Insufficient progress due to insufficient practice may result in withdrawal from the program.

How do I enroll in the Instrumental Music Program?

Instrumental Music students who are currently in Year 6 at Moranbah East State School or Moranbah State School will automatically receive an invitation to enroll in the Instrumental Program in Term 4.
